We initiate in organising such legal aid camps in collaboration with District Legal Services Authority. Number of students participate and render their services in such camps by giving free legal aid to the poor and needy and create an awareness among them on the burning issues like- domestic violence, gender sensitization, women empowerment, corruption, property disputes etc.
