

BRIEF ANALYSIS OF FEEDBACK

Nurturing education among the students is a wonderful experience. We at Narayanrao Chavan Law College impart legal education to students with an optimistic view to make their future glorious. We arrange remedial coaching for the weak and slow learners and try our level best to improve their academic level. After completion of these classes feedback is taken from the students.

The college being a research centre, number of PhD students is being registered at the centre. We provide every facility to them and help out to resolve the issues relating to research.
